As ever, sat navs were relegated to the door bins as the route had been meticulously described, over five pages of step-by-step directions, and interesting facts about sights along the way helped everyone stay on route. In total, the Fixers carried out eight dry-runs of the route to make sure that no-one missed a 'triangularabout', or the chance to visit the village that doubles as Downton on TV. The rather soggy Minis ended their tour through the Cotswolds at the Trout Inn in Lechlade on Thames.

Fixer Gary Haynes said: "Every year we

try to find the narrowest, tightest, most unclassified roads and most obscure villages off the beaten track that we can. That's the logic behind the route. So many people have said to us that they didn't realise just how beautiful the Cotswolds are until they had done this run."

A special prize of Mini-themed goodies was presented to Adam Bloomfield and Cat Winnett, along with dog Baxter, who braved the weather and not only camped the night before the run, but also the Friday evening. The event will return in 2016, with another new route, on Sunday, 31 July.
